

■ ■ ■ **DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR VISA APPLICATION**

- All EU citizens (except for Cypriots) require a visa for Kenya. This can be obtained either at the Embassy or by submitting an electronic visa application. Visas may also be obtained at any Port of Entry of the Republic of Kenya.
- Children aged 16 and below do not require a visa to enter Kenya. (This exemption does not apply to East Africa tourist visas.)

■ ■ ■ **DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO APPLY FOR A VISA AT THE EMBASSY IN BRUSSELS:**

- A **passport** which allows the bearer to enter Kenya. The passport must be valid at least 6 months after the date of return and must contain at least two blank pages.
- A visa **application form** duly completed and signed by the applicant.
- One recent passport-size **photograph**, stapled to the application form.
- **Visa fees:**
 - Amount: tourism/business: 40 €
transit: 20 €
multiple entry (*upon approval*): 80 €
East Africa tourist visa: 80 €
 - Payment of Visa fees is by **Bancontact only**. Credit cards are not accepted.
 - For applications **through the post**, the fees are to be paid into the Embassy's account, **no. BE07 3100 5224 2266** (BIC: *BBRUBEBB*), mentioning "*visa fees*" + *name(s)*. Proof of transfer of the visa fees must be enclosed.
- **Proof of the intended visit**, i.e. one of the following: copy of the (electronic) air ticket, copy of the invoice, attestation from the travel agency, letter from the employer or invitation. For *transit visas*, applicants are required to provide evidence of the onward trip. For *East Africa tourist visas*, the proof must show the first entry and the final departure from the joint territory of the three countries. In addition, a copy of the tourist circuit through the EA region should be attached to the application. [*Kindly provide photocopies of the attachments as they will be preserved by the Embassy.*]

- The embassy returns passports **exclusively by bpack**. Applicants wishing to have their passports returned by mail required to include the following:-
 - **in Belgium**: a pre-paid and duly completed "bpack 24h" sticker (preferably with a padded envelope), or a "bpack 24h Mini" box (see www.bpost.be).
 - **to Luxembourg**: a "bpack World" or "bpack World Light" postage fee, to be transferred separately to the Embassy's account, and mentioning: "postage fee" + name(s) + the bpack type. More information can be obtained from the bpost website: www.bpost.be/site/fr/residential/parcels/index.html.
 - **note**: The Embassy does not accept payments for registered post or for "bpack World Express", or payments in the form of cash, postal stamps or postal vouchers.

- Please verify the specific requirements for a **multiple entry visa** application under the heading "*Information on types of visas & fees*".

- Visa applications at the embassy are **by appointment only**. An appointment can be made by calling or sending an email.

- Visa applications can be submitted from Monday to Friday, from **9h30 till 13h00** and from **14h00 till 15h30**. The visa is issued the following day in most cases. Applications sent by mail are processed once the visa fees have been received in the Embassy's account.

- Visas can be applied for **maximum three months** before departure.

- There are no compulsory **vaccinations**. However, travellers are advised to contact a GP or the Institute of Tropical Medicine in Antwerp. It is also advisable to take malaria prophylactics, according to medical advice.

- Applicants travelling to Kenya for the purpose of taking up employment (as volunteer, employee or self-employed) or studying there, must have an **immigration permit** before applying for a visa. The permit is issued by the:
